Members Attend Department Of Insurance Workshop

On December 7, 1993, the Florida Department of Insurance held a workshop regarding proposed rules regulating public adjusters. Approximately fifteen F.A.P.I.A. members attended the workshop. President, Ray Altieri, addressed several matters. and thought the meeting went quite well.

Phil Fountain, an investigator with the Bureau of Agency Investigations, indicated that the reason for the proposed rules came as a result from various complaints and concerns following Hurricane Andrew. He acknowledged that most of the violations arose from public adjusters who are not from Florida, but came into the state unlicensed.

Department Attorney Kenneth Levine explained that the purpose of the workshop was to allow input from public adjusters and others, concerning the possible ramifications of the proposed rules. He indicated that the rules were merely proposals and very susceptible to change since this was the first opportunity for the public to review the rules and make fair comment regarding the same. He also indicated that he had extended the time for response to the proposed rules through January 7, 1994, for those wishing to send additional comments. Forward the same to room 116 Larson, Building 200 E. Gaines St., Tallahassee, FL (ATTN: Kenneth Levine).

Significantly, after hearing from a number of F.A.P.I.A. members, Levine admitted the language of the solicitation regulation was overly broad and that it was not his intent to prevent public adjusters from soliciting or carrying normal discussions with potential clients. He indicated that the purpose of the rule was to prevent solicitation of the public by individuals who were "runners", or by unlicensed firms, as was the practice immediately following Hurricane Andrew.
